



# Engineering Work-based Qualifications

**As an employer have you thought about the future of your organisation and how to maintain the level of skills?**

The College offers Scottish Vocational Qualifications (SVQs) and Modern Apprenticeships (MAs) in the following engineering disciplines:

- Engineering Maintenance (Mechanical and/or Electrical)
- Engineering Mechanical Manufacturing
- Engineering Installation and Commissioning
- Electrical and Electronic Engineering
- Engineering Technical Support
- Fabrication and Welding.

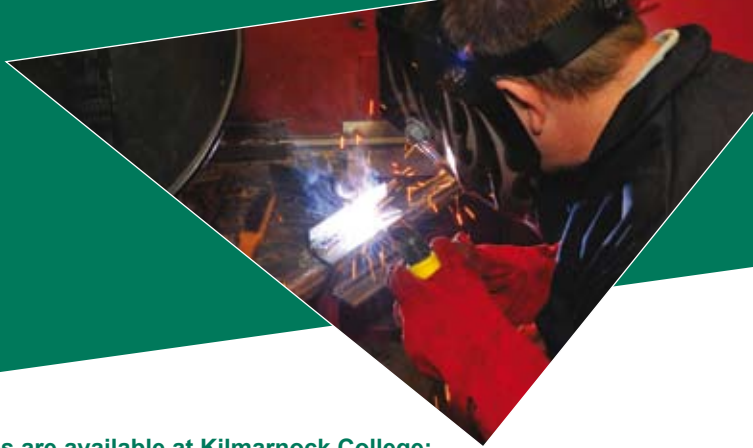
In addition, we also offer Business - Improvement Techniques (B-IT).

The College is fortunate to have received funding from Skills Development Scotland (SDS) for Modern Apprenticeships in Engineering at Level 3. Modern Apprentices can be recruited from your existing workforce and allows those already in work to undertake a qualification (lasting approximately three years) that reflects the skills they use in the workplace.

Alternatively, the College has full-time students who are available for flexible work placements of up to four weeks. These students have already completed an SVQ at Level 2 and therefore only require an additional two years training. Many companies have benefitted from this opportunity and have offered our students employment as a result of a successful placement.
